

Admission Policy

Applications for enrollment at T.R.U.T.H. Preparatory Academy (TPA) to be included in the lottery for the upcoming school year must be received by the school no later than April 1 each year.

Enrollment Preference Policy

Preference will be given to:

- Siblings of students currently enrolled and in attendance at TPA. These include:
 1. Any child of a family unit related biologically, by marriage or adoption to one or both parents;
 2. Any child in long-term placement within a foster-care situation. In such situations, documentation from a case manager, judge or court must be provided.
- Any child of an employee of TPA.

Lottery Process

- Kindergarten

Lottery will be held every April 5 (or the next school day if scheduling conflict occurs). Applications received by the cut-off date will be sorted in two groups/pools: those who have siblings and those who don't. TPA admits 40 students to its Kindergarten program each school year. The following procedure is applied to select the 40 Kindergarten candidates:

1. If less than 40 Kindergarten candidates apply by the cut-off date, all of them will be admitted.
2. If more than 40 candidates apply for Kindergarten position, the following step-bystep procedure will be applied
 - 2.1. Determine the number of applicants who have siblings. If there are less than 40 such students, admit all of them. Draw lottery from the pool of candidates with no siblings, fill all remaining vacancy and place the rest in wait list;
 - 2.2. If there are more than 40 applicants with siblings, draw a lottery from that pool to select 40 students. Place the rest on the wait list. Lottery will also be drawn from the pool for those who have no siblings and those candidates will be placed in the wait list in the order that their names were drawn.

Applicants for Grades 1 through 12

Admission to grade 1 through grade 12 is also based on lottery. Admission lottery will be drawn on April 15 each school year. The lottery drawing process will be the same as above.

Enrolling Students from the Wait List

When there is an opening at any grade level, an administrative designee will contact the first person on the wait list for that grade level. If that student is unable to enroll at that time, the next person on the list will be contacted.
